FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: What is the Women's Resource Center?

A: WRC is a non-profit United Way agency created and operated by women for women. WRC is a place where women receive information about services available in our community, along with education, advice, and support from caring staff and volunteers.

Q: Why should I call the Women's Resource Center?

A: We all face difficult transitions and changes during our lives, but no woman should have to "go it alone." Call the WRC if you are dealing with divorce, starting a new career, caring for a loved one, or coping with just about any of life's challenges. You will find the help you need here.

Q: How can I help the Women's Resource Center?

A: Volunteers are a cornerstone of the support services we offer. We welcome volunteers, student interns, and financial contributions in any amount.



The Women's Resource Center promotes the self-reliance of women by assessing needs, providing services and acting as a gateway to community resources.

Information Gateway

Community Resource Counselors

Meet with a Community Resource Counselor, a trained volunteer who will listen supportively and assist you in developing a game plan. Free 60-minute individual sessions are available to women 18 and over. Call about available Spanish-speaking counselors.

Legal Information and Referrals

Schedule a free 15-minute phone consultation with an attorney in the following areas of law: financial, divorce, immigration, civil, criminal, and more. Call about available Spanish-speaking attorneys.

Community Resource Room

Find printed information from over 400 agencies offering assistance. Resource room also includes educational packets on legal issues affecting women (in English and Spanish).

Community Bulletin Boards

Check job listings, upcoming events, etc.

Library and Computer Lab

Borrow materials, conduct research, and access the Internet--on a limited-time basis.

Sign up for a pre-employment training program for displaced homemakers designed to build self-esteem, employment skills, and so much more. Topics covered include identifying career goals, resumé writing, networking, interviewing, etc. Childcare, transportation, and educational stipends are available to those who meet eligibility requirements.

Self Esteem

Build your self-esteem in a 4-part workshop series, offered monthly during day and evening hours.
